Dear friends in Christ:

As Catholics, we are sacramental people and know the importance and power of outward signs and symbols. We know the strength and richness of words and symbols. We also know when we misuse or poorly use words and symbols, they can convey the wrong message, and how hurtful our words and actions can be. This is true in all aspects of our lives. However, when we habitually misuse words and symbols or when we habitually fail to recognize their impact, we can grow complacent to the message that we are sending out. Worse still, when our poor choices are pointed out to us, rather than being grateful for the fraternal correction, we become needlessly offended and resentful. There is little doubt that social norms have changed over the years. As a young boy, I remember when the Astrodome (“the 8<sup>th</sup> Wonder of the World”) opened. People dressed up in their “Sunday clothes” to go watch a ball game! The Oilers legendary coach, Bum Phillips, would never wear his cowboy hat in the dome because his mama taught him that gentlemen don’t wear hats indoors! Going downtown, visiting the doctor or even taking an airline flight were occasions to “dress up.” These seem peculiar and odd today with our very casual attitudes to attire and dress. But then as now, our attire does send a message. Most of us would not attend a reception or business gathering in shorts and flip flops. We wouldn’t show up to a meeting with an important client in their office attired in a jogging outfit or ratty jeans and a t-shirt. Why? The answer is simple; out of respect for what we are doing, the other person and out of self respect! We want to show and give the right message. Over the years, businesses have adopted “casual Fridays” or “office casual uniforms” to which there are still certain standards of what is acceptable and unacceptable attire. Why? Again, the answer is respect and that we do not want to send the wrong message by our attire.

Obviously, I am speaking to our attire at Holy Mass. Many people flippantly respond that God doesn’t care what we wear to church as long as we show up, so why should the priest or anyone else care what we wear to Mass. Who says? Where in the scriptures does it say that God doesn’t care? As a matter of fact, there are plenty of examples where the Scriptures say that God does care! (Remember the parable of the Wedding Feast!) Times and fashions have changed, but good manners and respect never go out of style. As the summer is fast approaching (and we all know how hot and humid it can get here in Houston), we should remember to approach our worship and praise of God with reverence and respect. Shorts, revealing and immodest attire are never appropriate in God’s house. (We shouldn’t wear immodest clothing anywhere!) Attire that is meant for the gym or swimming pool is best worn at the gym and swimming pool, not at church. What we do each week at Holy Mass is the most important activity of our week. We shouldn’t let our attire send a contradictory message. We should express our reverence for God and our respect for ourselves and others by our words, actions *and attire*. This goes for our behavior in the parking lot as well!

Needless to say, as summer vacations approach, we have *more time* to pray and come to church. It doesn’t mean we take a vacation from God and church. During the summer, when hopefully schedules are a little less hectic, consider coming to Eucharistic Adoration, daily Mass and confession **and by all means, bring the kids!!!!** If you are planning a get-away, have fun and get some rest, but remember to plan for Sunday Mass. God is so marvelously good to us. We are so rich in his grace and blessings. Let nothing keep us from proclaiming with our whole being the goodness of the Lord!

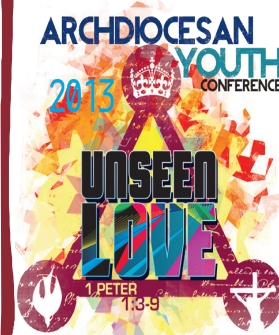

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD



At the end of His earthly life Jesus ascends triumphantly into heaven. The Church acclaim Him in His holy humanity, invited to sit on the Father's right hand and to share His glory. But Christ's Ascension is the pledge of our own. Filled with an immense hope, the Church looks up towards her leader, who precedes her into the heavenly home and takes her with Him in His own person: "for the Son of God, after incorporating in Himself those whom the devil's jealousy had banished from the earthly paradise, ascends again to His Father and takes them with Him" (St. Leo).

The ecclesiastical provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Newark, Philadelphia, and the State of Nebraska have retained the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord on the proper Thursday, while all other provinces have transferred this solemnity to today, the Seventh Sunday of Easter.

**The Ascension**

Besides the hope and the joyful expectancy of heaven so characteristic of the Ascension feast there is a note of melancholy. Before the final departure of Jesus, the Apostles must have been very much disturbed: each felt the distress of one who sees his dearest friend and companion going away forever, and finds himself alone to face all the difficulties of life. The Lord realized their state of mind and consoled them once more, promising the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Comforter: "He commanded them," we read in the Epistle (Acts 1:1-11), "that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but should wait for the promise of the Father... you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit, not many days hence." But even this time the Apostles did not understand! How much they needed to be enlightened and transformed by the Holy Spirit, in order to accomplish the great mission which was to be entrusted to them! Jesus continued "You shall receive the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon you and you shall be witnesses unto Me ... even to the uttermost part of the earth." For the moment, however, they were there, around the Master, weak, timid, frightened, like little children watching their mother leave for a distant, unknown land. In fact, "while they looked on, He was raised up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight." Two angels came to distract them from their great amazement and to make them realize what had happened. Then, placing their trust in the word of Jesus, which would henceforth be their only support, they returned to Jerusalem where, in the Cenacle, they awaited in prayer the fulfillment of the promise. It was the first novena in preparation for Pentecost: "All these were persevering with one mind in prayer with ... Mary, the Mother of Jesus" (ibid. 1:14).

Silence, recollection, prayer, peace with our brethren, and union with Mary: these are the characteristics of the novena we too should make in preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

A PRAYER TO MARY, THE QUEEN OF HEAVEN




The Hail Holy Queen (also commonly known by its Latin name, the *Salve Regina*) is one of four special anthems to the Mother of God that have traditionally been part of the Liturgy of the Hours, and which vary depending on the season. In the [Traditional Latin Mass](#), these anthems are also usually sung at a High Mass, either at the end of the Mass or during [Holy Communion](#).

In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Hail Holy Queen is recited from [Trinity Sunday](#) (the Sunday after [Pentecost Sunday](#)) until the Saturday before [Advent](#). This prayer is also commonly said at the end of the [rosary](#), in morning prayers, and during the prayers at the end of a Low Mass in the Traditional Latin Mass.

**Hail Holy Queen**

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of Mercy!  
 Our life, our sweetness, and our hope!  
 To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve;  
 to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.
