Dear friends in Christ:

With all of the excitement concerning Pope Benedict's resignation and the election of Pope Francis, one of the things that was pushed to the side was this year's designation as *The Year of Faith* in commemoration of the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Vatican II and the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the publication of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. At SJV, we marked the Year of Faith by having a wonderful presentation on Vatican II in the fall by Fr. Don Nesti, C.S.Sp. of the Institute of Faith and Culture at the University of St. Thomas, distributing thousands of copies of the *Outlines of the Catholic Faith* to parishioners and by presenting *The Catholicism Project* for nearly 1,800 adults in more than 100 small group settings this spring. Each of these programs was coordinated by our Adult Formation Department under Yvonne Gill and all were wonderfully successful. Yvonne was assisted by many volunteers from the parish who served on the various teams. *The Catholicism Project* alone required well over 100 parishioners to serve as volunteer leaders. Daniel Marcantel, our Director of Youth Formation, also assisted in this massive project. When I say 'massive', I am not exaggerating. Many parishes around the country undertook similar programs, but few to the extent of SJV. The participants in *The Catholicism Project* are the best evidence as to its success and to the need that all of us have to deepen our faith and our understanding of our Catholic Faith.

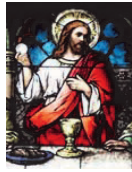
St. Anselm's famous maxim *Fides quaerens intellectum* (faith seeking understanding) is indeed an applicable motto for every Catholic. God reveals to us the truth of himself – in nature, in reason, in Sacred Scripture, in history, through the Church and most fully in His Only Begotten Son. Our positive response to God's self revelation is faith. As Catholics, we believe that God divinely reveals himself through Sacred Scripture (the Bible) and Sacred Tradition (The teaching of the Church). We also believe that he reveals himself through his creation and that all humans can come to a natural knowledge of God. The distinction is that through human reason we can deduce *that* God exists but through Divine Revelation we come to the knowledge of *who* God is. As part of our rich Catholic theological and intellectual heritage, we also distinguish *fides qua* and *fides quae*. "*Fides qua* refers to the act of faith, the personal commitment by which or through which an individual of community believes; *Fides quae* refers to the actual *content* of faith, that which is actually believed." (Consecrated Phrases, MGB/TLP 1998)

As Catholics called to live and share the good news of Jesus with a world that is growing more hostile to faith by the day, Pope Benedict gave us a great gift in this *Year of Faith*. We cannot take the gift of faith for granted, nor can we treat our faith merely like an heirloom. For our faith (*fides qua*) to be vibrant we must exercise it, deepen it, increase it, strengthen it, enrich it and share it! That means that all of us must continually throughout our lives strive to deepen our knowledge and understanding of the faith (*fides quae*) through study, reflection and prayer. We are also to be thankful for the gift of Catholic Faith. Recently, I went to confession and my confessor gave me the penance of offering a prayer of thanksgiving for the gift of my faith. I thought that was a beautiful penance for it made me think of how blessed I am to know God and his love and the great joy of living my life as a Catholic (don't be surprised if you come to confession and receive the same penance!).

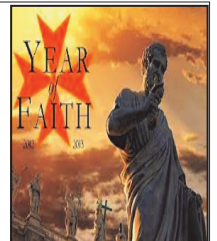

Around the year 50 a meeting was convened to discuss if and which Jewish traditions needed to be adopted by non-Jewish converts to Christianity. This meeting came to be known as the Council of Jerusalem. It was decided that Jewish traditions, notably circumcision and certain dietary rules, should not bind Gentile converts to the Christian faith. The leaders of the Church did impose some minimal dietary requirements. These restrictions may have been imposed so as to prevent any vestiges of idolatry from surviving among the new Christians.

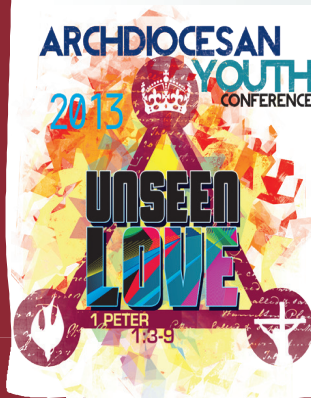

## BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Catholic practice of assigning a special devotion to each month goes back to the early 16th century. Since the best known of those devotions is probably the dedication of [May as the month of the Blessed Virgin Mary](#), it might come as a surprise that it wasn't until the late 18th century that this devotion arose among Jesuits in Rome. In the early years of the 19th century, it quickly spread throughout the Western Church, and, by the time of Pope Pius IX's declaration of the dogma of the [Immaculate Conception](#) in 1854, it had become universal.

May crownings and other special May events in honor of Mary, such as public recitation of the [rosary](#), stem from this time. Sadly, such communal events are more rare today, but we can take the month of May as an opportunity to renew our own devotion to the Mother of God by dusting off our rosaries and adding a few more [Marian prayers](#) to our daily routine.

Parents, in particular, should encourage Marian devotion in their children, since the non-Catholic Christians they encounter today often downplay (if not denigrate) the role that the Blessed Virgin played in our salvation through her *fiat*-her joyous "Yes" to the will of God.
