Dear friends in Christ:

One of the observations of Pope Francis made by those who note such things is that he repeats himself! Different from his immediate predecessors who used almost every talk as a vehicle to introduce or give instruction on a wide variety of topics, Pope Francis is noted for repeating a few basic themes, even using the same words. I am certain that this harkens back to his days of teaching in Jesuit schools. As a teacher (a parent or a pastor) it is often repeat, repeat, repeat! Repetition is often used in the sincere hope that if you repeat something often enough it may start to sink in. One of the often repeated themes of Pope Francis that has been cited is that the Church needs to go out to the peripheries. The funny part of this is that while Pope Francis' vocabulary and style are somewhat different than that of his predecessors, the message is not. Someone would be hard pressed to find a pope over the last two thousand years who has not had the same message. Not only is this message not new or original, it is really Jesus' message! The pope is simply restating and presenting what is central to the vocation of the Church, "*Go, therefore and make disciples of all the nations and baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.*" (Mt 28:19,20). As Pope Paul VI said "the vocation of the church is evangelization" or as our own bishop, Cardinal DiNardo has stated, "the mission of the church is mission!"

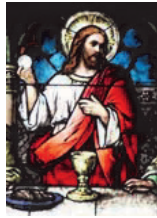
Blessed John Paul II and Pope Benedict ushered in the "New Evangelization". Whereas the first evangelization was to people, societies and cultures who had previously not heard the gospel, the *New Evangelization* is directed to persons, societies and cultures who have already heard the good news of Jesus but need to hear it again and anew. Indeed, this is the Church's vocation, which means it is everyone's vocation. But what does this mean for us in our day to day lives? It means that we must love others enough to share with them our faith. In the simplest terms we invite people to come to a knowledge of and relationship with Jesus Christ and his holy Catholic Church! We give witness to our faith by living and letting our joy in Jesus shine through our lives. It means that we don't hide our faith, but we exalt in it. We don't preserve the faith as an antique; we share the faith by inviting others to see and experience what we have found.

Many people know little of the Catholic faith, even many Catholics. For some they only know what they see in the media or hear from uninformed (and sometimes hostile) sources. Fighting and arguing with people does little good, but kindly inviting and seeking to share the beauties of our faith with others can go a long way. Do you know a Catholic who never goes to Mass? Invite them to come with you. Make it easy for them, offer to go and pick them up. Do you know someone who doesn't have a church? Invite them to come with you next weekend. I always find feeding people helps too! Offer to take them to brunch after Mass. Do you know someone who is not Catholic but has questions about Catholicism? Invite them to RCIA or to one of our adult formation programs. Buy them a little question and answer catechism or a booklet on the teachings of the Church. Do you know someone who is not Christian? Share the beautiful stories of Jesus with them. Share with them the beautiful stories of how Jesus has blessed *you!* And remember to follow Pope Francis' lead. It is OK to repeat yourself and your invitation, for it usually takes three times before people can hear us. Each of us has our own style and our own voice, but it is the still the same message and the same good news!

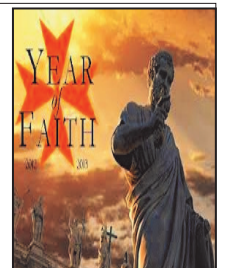

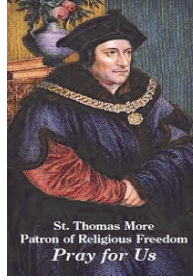

SAINT OF THE DAY



St. Thomas More
(1478 – 1535)

His belief that no lay ruler has jurisdiction over the Church of Christ cost Thomas More his life.

Beheaded on Tower Hill, London, July 6, 1535, he steadfastly refused to approve Henry VIII's divorce and remarriage and establishment of the Church of England.

Described as "a man for all seasons," More was a literary scholar, eminent lawyer, gentleman, father of four children and chancellor of England. An intensely spiritual man, he would not support the king's divorce from Catherine of Aragon in order to marry Anne Boleyn. Nor would he acknowledge Henry as supreme head of the Church in England, breaking with Rome and denying the pope as head.

More was committed to the Tower of London to await trial for treason: not swearing to the Act of Succession and the Oath of Supremacy. Upon conviction, More declared he had all the councils of Christendom and not just the council of one realm to support him in the decision of his conscience.

Four hundred years later, in 1935, Thomas More was canonized a saint of God. Few saints are more relevant to our time. In fact, in 2000, Blessed John Paul II named him patron of political leaders. The supreme diplomat and counselor, he did not compromise his own moral values in order to please the king, knowing that true allegiance to authority is not blind acceptance of everything that authority wants. King Henry himself realized this and tried desperately to win his chancellor to his side because he knew More was a man whose approval counted, a man whose personal integrity no one questioned. But when Thomas resigned as chancellor, unable to approve the two matters that meant most to Henry, the king had to get rid of Thomas More.

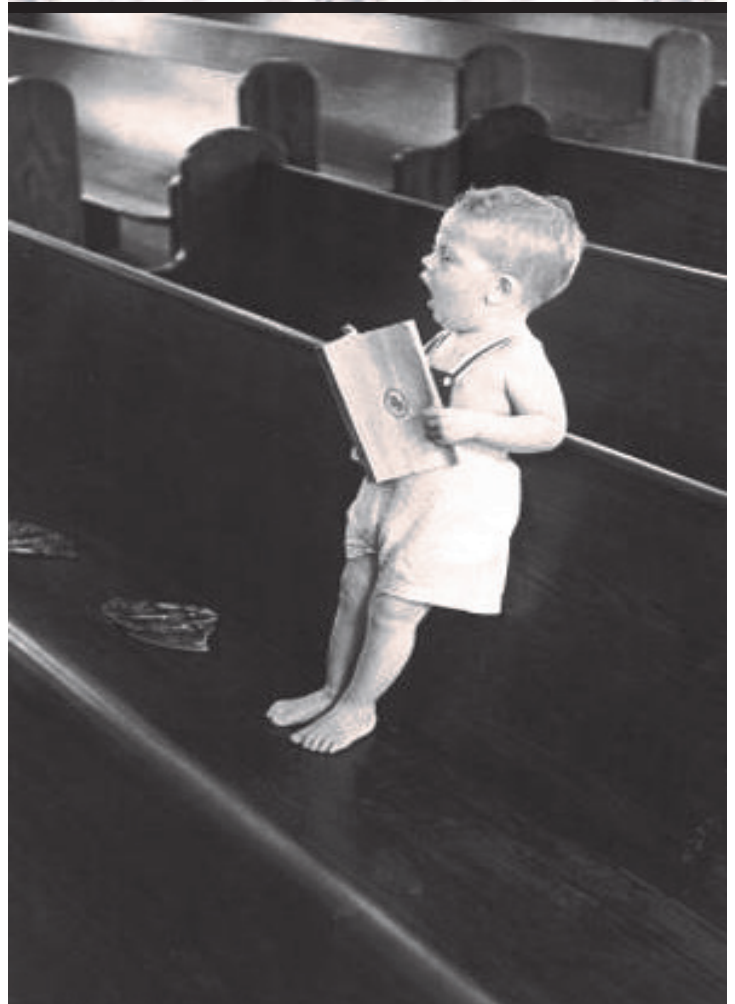

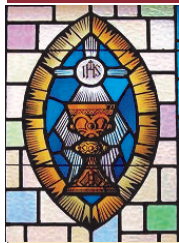

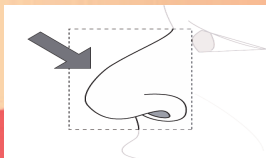
